➤ **Pathway to Graduate-Entry Doctor of Medicine**

In 2015 Flinders introduced *new* opportunities to study graduate entry Medicine with up to 75 percent of places reserved for Flinders students. In addition to the undergraduate pathway, places will be reserved for:

- ✓ 25 students from the Bachelor of Health Sciences, Medical Science, Paramedic Science, and
- ✓ 33 graduates of any Flinders course.

➤ **Early Achievers' Program**

As a Year 12 student, do you demonstrate leadership in your school or workplace, coordinate a community initiative, volunteer in a local cultural, sporting or religious group or provide care to someone in need?

Australian Catholic University's *Early Achievers' Program (EAP)* recognises a students' potential to achieve great things. Gaining a place in the desired course is dependent on meeting the University's minimum entry requirements and subject prerequisites, regardless of success in the program.

The program operates at each of the University's six campuses nationally. Applications will open in August and close in October, with offers being made by the end of November 2016.

➤ **New Bachelor of Teaching/Bachelor of Science in 2017**

This course will prepare graduates with the skills to apply an understanding of a broad and coherent body of scientific knowledge to work in a range of science contexts within an education setting. - According to the Times Higher Education 2015 Rankings, La Trobe is listed among the top 100 universities under the age of 50
- La Trobe has more than 35 000 students and 4 000 staff
